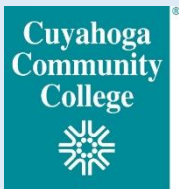

CUYAHOGA COMMUNITY COLLEGE (Tri-C)

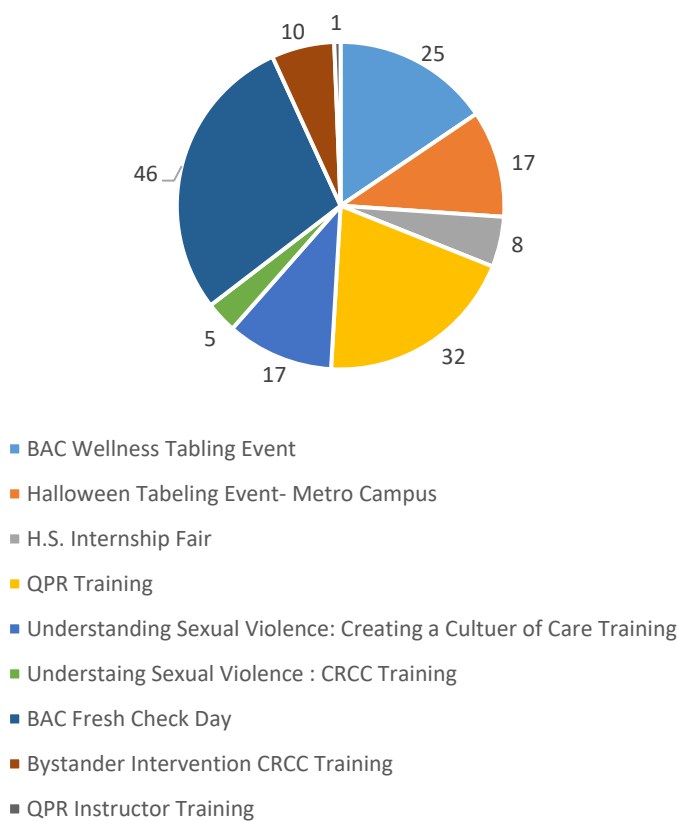
The purpose of these grants is to promote collaboration between college/university and community stakeholders to develop programming to prevent suicide, promote mental health and reduce stigma about mental illness or its treatment on campus.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Tri-C will collaborate with Cleveland Rape Crisis Center (CRCC) to provide two training sessions. Educational and promotional materials, community resources, Active Minds materials, and other resource will be distributed to all participants attending the events. Tri-C will work with current Active Minds student members to engage with students on campus at the Active Minds table during tabling events where they will engage in additional activities intended to begin the conversation regarding mental wellness and suicide prevention. Tri-C will integrate ongoing QPR training for students along with Active Minds activities and supportive services. One Active Minds advisor will complete Question, Persuade, Refer (QPR) Gatekeeper instructor training through the QPR Institute.

Highlights

During the reporting period, the third Metro Active Minds Advisor was trained and certified as a QPR Gatekeeper Instructor. The two other Advisors of the Tri-C Metro Chapter of the Active Minds Student Organization were trained and certified as QPR Gatekeeper Instructors in 2022, under the previous grant award. Each QPR Instructor Certification lasts for three years. This will allow the Advisors to continue to train members of the Metro Chapter of Active Minds, Tri-C students, faculty, staff and community members as Certified QPR Gatekeepers, including all Human Services students enrolled in the HS-1120, Suicide Prevention & Intervention course.
